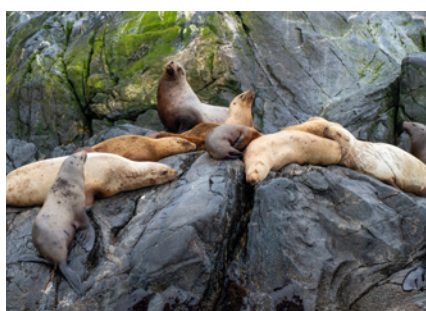

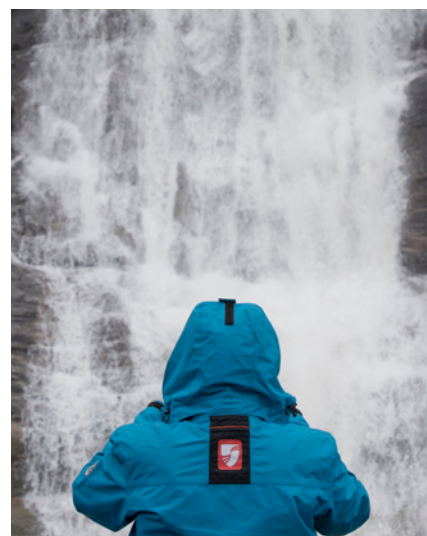

Seabourn's small-ship Alaska experience provides in-depth exploration with our extraordinary collection of optional expedition-style Ventures by Seabourn® excursions. Guided by our masterful Expedition Team of naturalists, scientists, glaciologists and wildlife experts, you will see Alaska the way few others do; at sea-level, glean unique insights and in-depth knowledge on the history, ecology and culture of the Last Frontier.

Featured excursions include:

- Zodiac the Inian Islands** - The Expedition Team takes you by Zodiac to explore the lesser travelled Inian Islands and Cross Sound, only accessible by sea. Cross Sound is one of the main gateways for humpback whales to enter the sheltered waters of Alaska, and the Zodiac allows you to get close to all the highlights of an incredibly beautiful environment that is densely populated by Steller sea lions, humpback whales, horned and tufted puffins, sea otters, harbor seals, bald eagles and other birdlife.
- Zodiac the North/South Sawyer Glacier or Endicott Arm** - Legendary scenery, abundant wildlife and boundless beauty await as you travel by Zodiac through Tracy Arm to Sawyer Glacier, or to Dawes Glacier on Endicott Arm. Watch for waterfalls and wildlife, including a variety of birdlife, mountain goats, sea lions and harbor seals. Operated by a skilled Expedition Team member, the Zodiac excursion provides a breathtaking water-level perspective of the glacier and surrounding ice formations (ice conditions permitting), with the chance to witness icebergs calving from the best vantage point.
- Kayak Hubbard Glacier** - Guided by an Expedition Team member, paddle a kayak amidst the grandeur of North America's largest and most spectacular tidewater glacier, Hubbard Glacier. Towering icy cliffs rise up to 400 feet, creating a breathtaking backdrop.
- Rainbow Falls Trail Adventure Hike (Wrangell, Alaska)** - Join local guides and an Expedition team member on this hike the Rainbow Trail in Alaska's temperate rain forest, where the guide will share the natural history and the human history of the region. The entire hike is along a manmade boardwalk that winds through incredible forest scenery, including a beautiful creek and the magnificent Rainbow Falls.

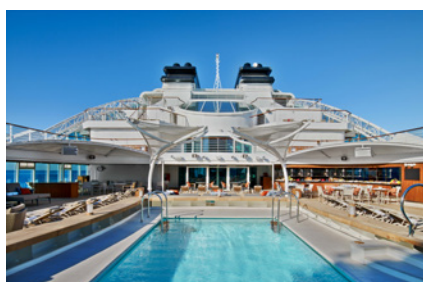
Seabourn Encore is the perfect ship for Alaska explorations, her intimate size enabling her to visit out of the way destinations where larger ships cannot go.

Guests may choose from four restaurants and a host of dining options from casual



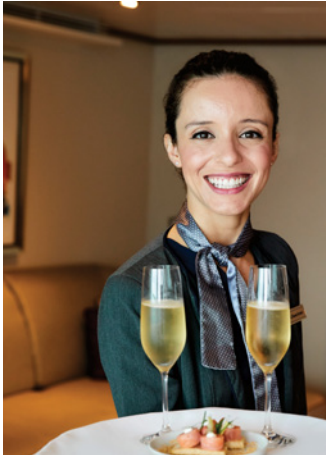

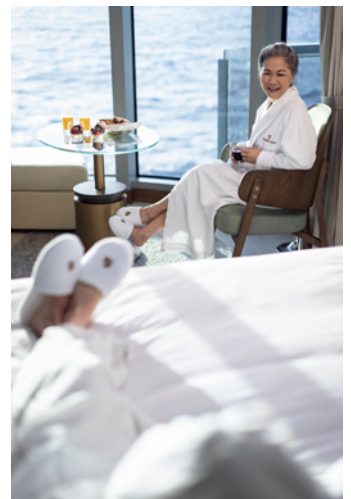
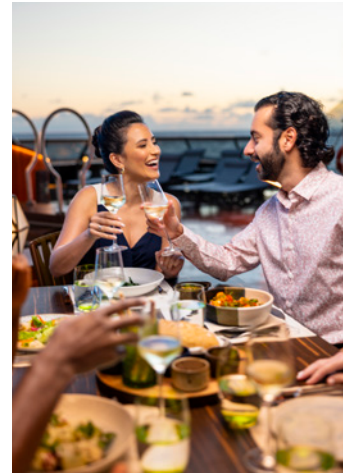

Our Itinerary Highlight

14-Day Alaska Glaciers, Fjords & Inside Passage

The ultimate Alaska exploration, sailing roundtrip from Vancouver. Here are a few of our highlights.

Ketchikan. A picturesque coastal town with a colourful frontier history, standing at the southern entrance to Alaska's famed Inside Passage, Ketchikan was once dubbed the 'Canned Salmon Capital of the World'. The renowned Creek Street, perched on stilts along the mouth of the creek, would bring lasting infamy to the area for the red-light district that burgeoned there during the Gold Rush.



Sitka. The oldest city in Alaska - only accessible by air and sea - was nicknamed the "Paris of the Pacific" for the growing wealth acquired during its logging, gold, and fur trade booms. The town was sold to the USA by Russia in 1867, and picturesque remnants of Russia's architectural influence are still present as well as Tlingit tradition.

Yakutat Bay, 18 miles wide at its entry, is gateway to the huge Hubbard Glacier, North America's largest tidewater glacier. As the bay narrows and the shorelines draw closer, the 400-foot face of the glacier exerts a luminous, ghostly presence, with floating ice dimpling the surface of the water, and seals bobbing up and down.

The Inian Islands: For millennia, Tlingit people came here to hunt and fish and today, the Inian Islands Institute provides access to the abundant and protected waters for scientific research. Sitka black-tailed deer and brown bears frequent their rugged shores, while sea lions rest on rocky outcrops. Travellers will see sea otters, bald eagles, and humpback whales in great numbers during summer.

Icy Strait Point. Located on Chichagof Island near the entry to Glacier Bay National Park, this unique community was created and is owned by a corporation of over 1300 Native Americans of various local Tlingit

tribes, for the purpose of offering visitors an enjoyable, educational experience of Alaska's native cultures.

Haines. Home to the largest concentration of bald eagles on earth, and grizzly bears gorge themselves on spawning salmon in its rivers, Haines was originally named Dteshuh, which means 'end of the trail' in the language of the Chilkat natives. The first Europeans arrived in 1879 to build a school and a Presbyterian mission. Haines grew dramatically during the 1899 Klondike gold rush in the Yukon, supplying prospectors with food and equipment.

Juneau. Alaska's capital is accessible only by air and sea, due to the rugged mountain terrain that surrounds the city. You may choose to explore on foot along the Perseverance Trail or around Mendenhall Glacier, board one of the many local whale-watching boats or view the mountains and extensive glaciers of the Juneau Icefield from a helicopter.

Tracy Arm Fjords: Brown and black bears, wolves, deer, mountain goats, seals and many seabirds frequent this vast region, one fifth covered with ice and designated a wilderness area in 1980. 'Ventures by Seabourn' optional activities include Zodiac, Kayak and even Catamaran glacier exploration.

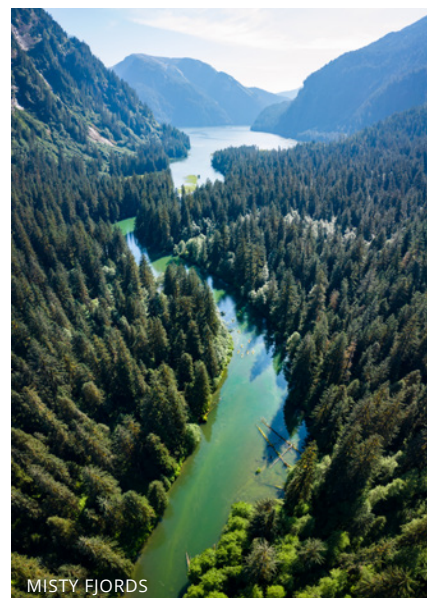
Wrangell. Located at the heart of the Tongass National Rain Forest, the island receives approximately 80" (203 cm) of rain per year. The history of Wrangell is deeply rooted in the Tlingit people, the fur trade and the gold rush. The Stikine River trade route brought the Tlingit people here thousands of years ago, evidenced by some forty petroglyphs at Petroglyph Beach State Historic Site and Totem Park.



The Lynn Canal: Named by George Vancouver after his birthplace, Kings Lynn in Norfolk, the canal was a crucial passageway to the Klondike gold fields during the Gold Rush. More than 2,000 feet in depth, it's one of the deepest and longest fjords in the world.

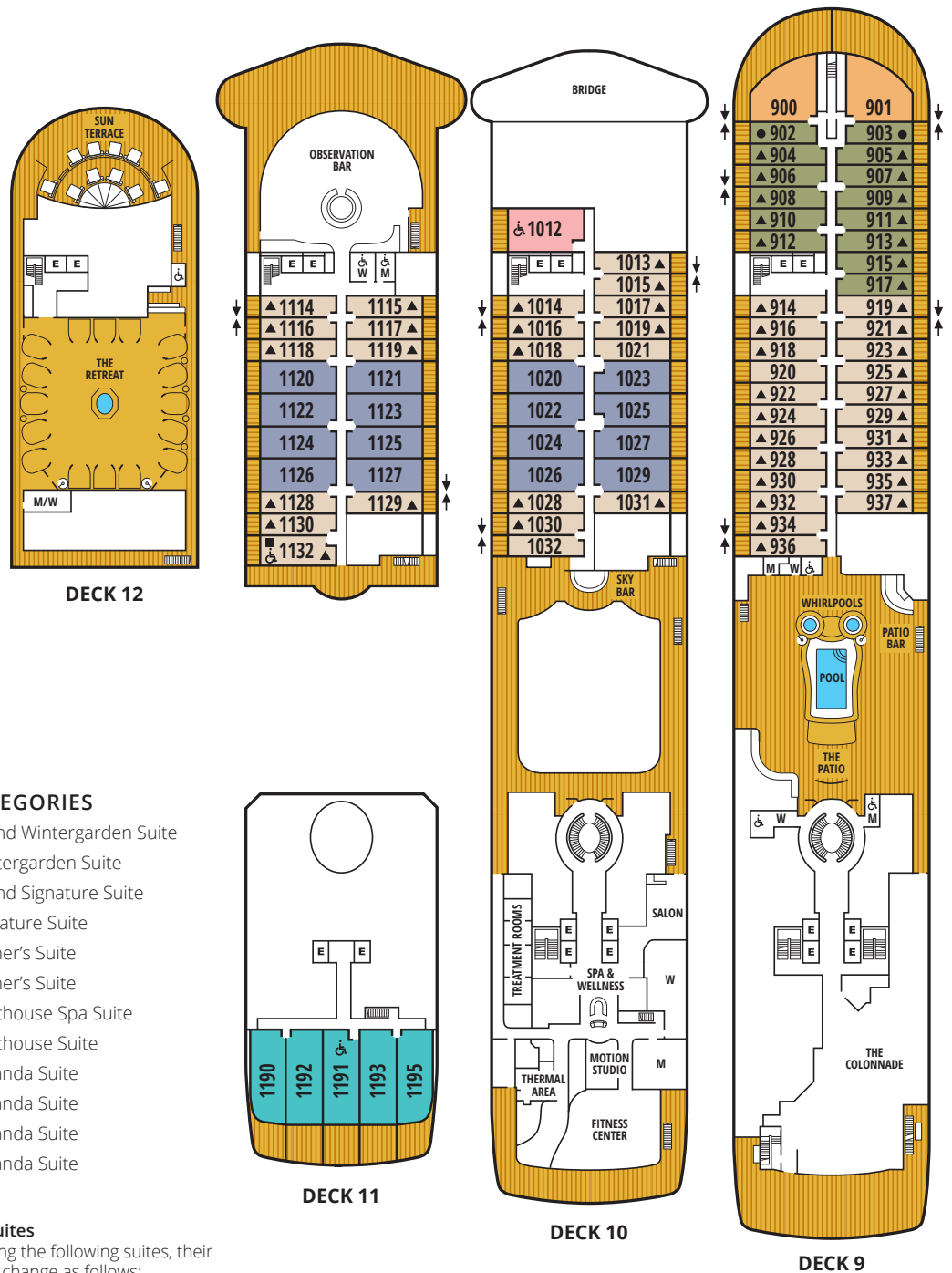
Misty Fjords National Monument consists of over two million acres of deeply cut forested fjords cradled in U-shaped valleys between mountains rising up to 3,000 feet above sea level, inspiring the explorer John Muir to proclaim them among the most beautiful places he had ever seen. Seabourn Encore will cruise among spectacular forests, waterfalls and mountains, with 'Ventures by Seabourn' optional excursions that include kayaking the fjords or sightseeing by floatplane.

Alert Bay. A walk along the shores of this tiny 0.69-square mile island will amaze you with its history, spectacular views and abundant wildlife. Remnants of its former fish-salting plant from the 1800's remain along the harbour, while the U'mista Cultural Centre is Canada's longest-running First Nations Museum and home to the famed Potlatch Collection of ceremonial regalia.

Wheelchair Accessible Suites

Suites 550, 664, 665, 1012, 1132, 1191 are wheelchair accessible—roll-in shower only, wheelchair-accessible doorways.

♣ Suites 700 and 701 are subject to noise when anchoring, and on Seabourn Encore, have all metal veranda railings, limiting the view. On Seabourn Ovation, the veranda railings are part metal and part glass from floor to teak rail.

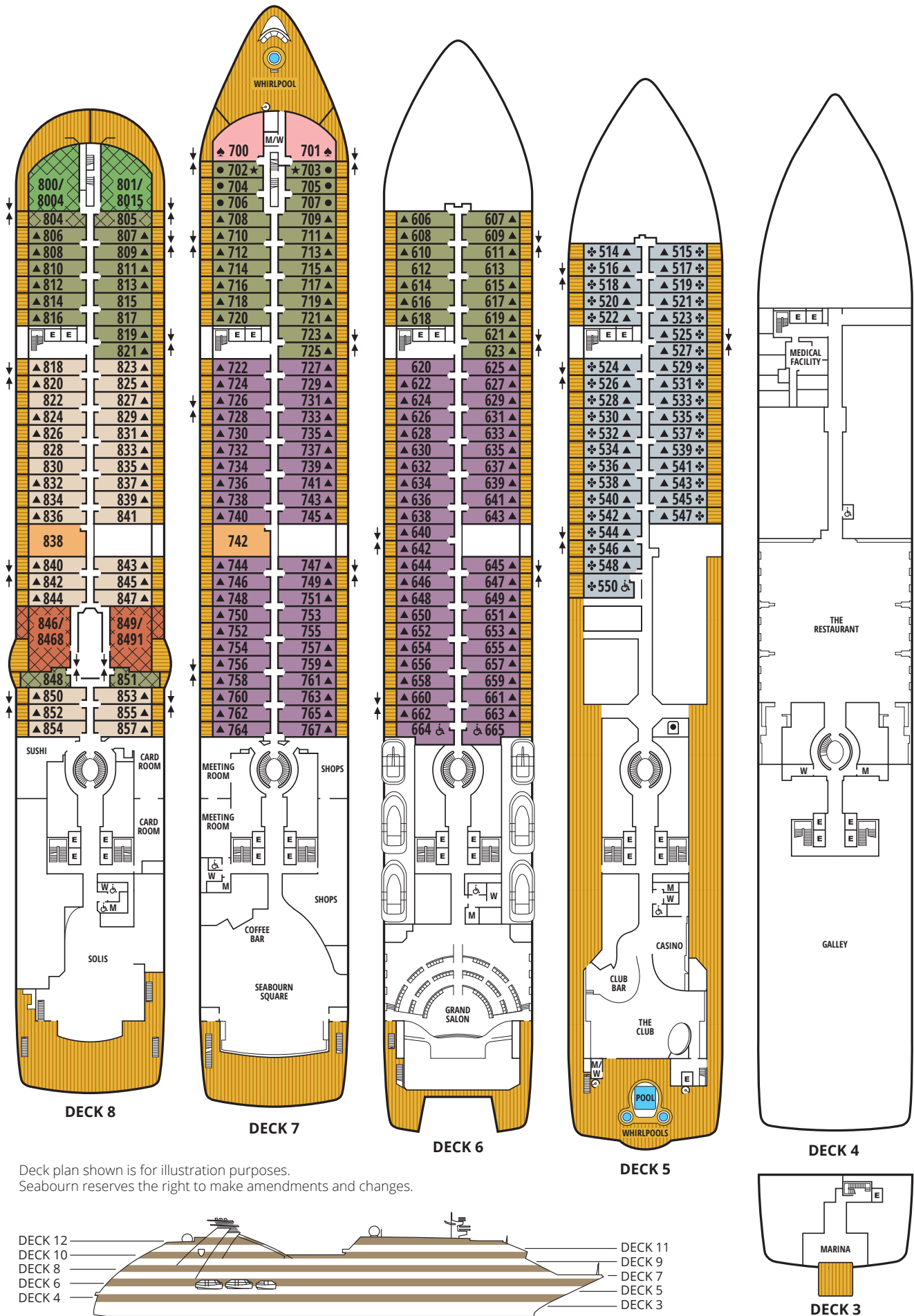
